

Minutes of the Booster Club Meeting on November 13, 2006

The meeting opened with the review and eventual adoption of the minutes from the October meeting.

The final audit results were discussed and financial records showed that football had more money in their account than what they thought they did. Also Teresa Wiedemer turned in a deposit ticket for \$75 that goes to the softball account. A motion to approve the financial records was made and approved.

As a result of the audit and the recommendations made by the audit committee it was decided that from this point on all money collected must be turned into the treasurer or for convenience may be dropped off at the funeral home. This will allow the treasurer to be able to maintain accurate balances in each and every account.

Chris Grayson discussed the upcoming Greater Clark Schools 1028 hearing scheduled for tomorrow night at the administration building. Chris informed the club that this begins the path for new construction of Charlestown High School and remodeling of Jeff and New Washington High Schools. If the 1028 passes, then within about a week people opposed to the project will have 30 days to gather 100 signatures of property tax payers to file a remonstrance. If this happens it is our understanding there will be a cooling off period of approximately 30 days. At the conclusion of this cooling off period then people who are for and against this project will have 30 days to gather as many signatures as they can. If the group who opposes the project has more signatures the project is halted for one year and the entire process must start from the beginning. If the supporters win then the project will move forward into the next phase which is appearing before the state tax

board. Chris encouraged everyone to attend this 1028 hearing. He also encouraged everyone to think of ways in which we might be able to gather signatures in support of the project if a remonstrance is completed.

A report was given about the current sound system and that no movement has occurred with our request before the school board.

It was decided that Pirate Pride Night would be held at 3 different ball games this year. Our first game would be on Dec. 15, 2006 and would be an elementary night similar to last years. This would be for a boys game against Providence. There would be a junior high night on Jan. 18, 2007 against Salem during the girls game and another boys night against Salem on Feb. 16, 2007. It was discussed that it is important to get the band to play at each of these games and David Null and Brian Davis were to try at talk with the band director about this. Brian Davis was to speak to the middle school and elementary schools about any possible conflicts they may have.

Brian Davis was to redo a bid on our window decals and report to the club at the next meeting. It was discussed to do 250 window decals and 500 bumper stickers.

Larry Baker brought up about getting a DVD camera to use between all sports. It was discussed that David Null would get with Mr. Clemence to get some idea on what he would recommend and to find out about what the cost would be. It was discussed that maybe each sport wishing to use this camera would also provide some of the funding for the camera.

With no further discussion the meeting was adjourned at 8:15 p.m.
